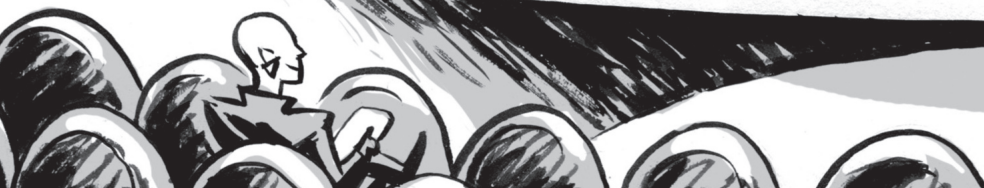
Victor Frankenstein
